
Destination of S.6 school leavers





Percentage of students meeting the minimum local university entrance requirement (Levels 332A22 in HKDSE) for university programmes: 95.7%.

- · L: Languages: Expanding linguistic horizons and fostering cultural understanding.


Through these components, CARMEL provides a holistic environment where gifted and talented students can thrive and reach their full potential.


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3. STEAM at Carmel: Igniting Innovation

There were more than 400 applicants for the 40 discretionary places. A total of 124 students were admitted to the school via EDB's Secondary School Places Allocation (SSPA) system. All of our S1 students are of high academic calibre.

Information on Making an Application for the S1 Discretionary Places 2025-2026

- 1. Selection criteria for admission:
 - a. Academic performance in P4, P5 and P6 (40%)
 - b. Conduct (20%)
 - c. Extra-curricular activities (20%).
 - d. Performance in the admissions interview (20%).
- 2. The application form can be downloaded at http://www.carmelss.edu.hk



- 3. Recommendation letters from primary school principals are **not necessary**.
- 4. Interviews will be conducted in March 2025.
 - a. All applicants will be invited for an interview.
 - b. The interview will consist of Chinese and English sessions and each will last for about 10 minutes.
 - c. Parents / Guardians will meet with school personnel for about 5 minutes.
